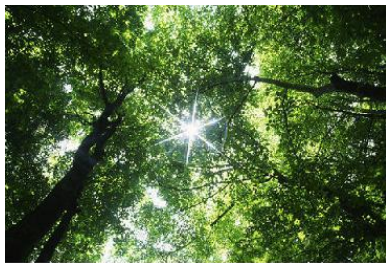


CDL ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY & INITIATIVES

It includes all areas of CDL's activities and will result in an Environmental Management System based on the principles of ISO 14001 which CDL aim to have completed by the 4th quarter of 2011. CDL will implement the preservation of the environment into its business principles and guidelines.

CDL's Green Charter

1. CDL incorporates in its business principles and processes efforts to maintain and improve the environment through careful use of resources, avoidance of waste and responsible conduct in all environmental issues.
2. CDL will comply with all environmental laws and regulations as well as the requirements of customers and other business partners. CDL will support business partners in achieving their regulatory objectives.
3. CDL will establish ecologically responsible conduct as an integral element of its management review process and will define corporate goals for environmental protection
4. CDL will implement a documentation process for all environmental issues (related to its business activities) which facilitates reviews and audits whenever required.
5. CDL will seek preferred partner status with suppliers and customers, based on its environmental strategy.
6. CDL will include all employees and other major stakeholders in regular communication regarding its environmental efforts.

CDL ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY

Why

There are many good reasons why CDL should have an environmental policy and subsequently, an environmental management system:

1. It is the right thing to do, as the preservation of the environment and sustainable conduct of business contribute to long-term survival and success.
2. It is increasingly required by our customers and suppliers and will improve cooperation with both groups.
3. It will encourage potential employees to join CDL.
4. It will reduce CDL's impact on the environment, by saving raw material and energy, and will help CDL to comply with laws and regulations.
5. It will improve cost control, although not necessarily save costs.
6. It will improve CDL's image in the marketplace, with all stakeholders (customers, suppliers and employees, communities and authorities)

What

Many areas of CDL's activities impact the environment and the first task will be to review possible environmental enhancements. Going forward, the environmental Policy will include the following aspects:

1. CDL will create a forward-looking and dynamic environmental project plan. The first phase will be defined by actions that help us to achieve the same environmental status as many of our business partners.
2. CDL will introduce a Group Environmental Management System (EMS) based on ISO 14001 as the benchmark. All sites will be certified and comply with its recommendations and guidelines.
3. Recommendations and guidelines of the CDL EMS should be respected by all employees, business partners and contractors.
4. All CDL managers are responsible for execution of the guidelines and prompt action in case of violations or problems.
5. Apart from some basic guidelines, CDL's environmental Policy is based on encouragement and active participation by all constituencies.

Fields of Action (precise measurable goals to be defined):

1. Work Environment: CDL will provide to its employees with a safe and healthy working environment
2. Energy & Materials: CDL will continue to improve its environmental performance by:
 - Minimising waste (incl. separation & recycling)
 - Usage of recycled materials (where applicable)
 - Recycling of packaging materials
 - Usage of biodegradable materials
 - Efficient use of water and energy (better power management equipment wherever possible)
 - Substitution of energy sources by renewable sources
 - Other internationally respected aspects of materials usage

3. Transportation (Logistics): CDL logistics will evaluate its transportation partners for environmental goals/behaviour and encourage its partners to set goals for higher efficiency in transportation.
4. Travel: CDL will use technology such as video conferencing to optimise travel behaviour and seek ways to minimize the carbon impact of its travel.
5. Car Policy: wherever applicable, CDL will encourage and foster a car policy that will reduce its carbon footprint.
6. IT: CDL will use IT resources and expertise to help reduce energy consumption of its electronics infrastructure.

When

CDL will strive to achieve an ISO 14001 compliant environmental management system by the 4th quarter of 2011. All the above actions shall depending on the rate of progress by location by then be implemented or goals defined for reduction and recycling metrics. CDL will continue to set new milestones for each fiscal year that will be approved by the CDL board and then executed.

CDL ENVIRONMENTAL INITIATIVES

To date CDL has actively demonstrated commitment to reduction of the carbon footprint by the following actions:

1. Capital investment in shredding machinery that converts disused boxes into filling material for packing. CDL has reduced its waste by one skip per week by employing this machinery.
2. 'Padpak' environmentally friendly filling material using brown sustainably sourced material.
3. Electric delivery vehicles – We have undergone tests with Modec and are trailing the vehicle on one of our delivery rounds. Subject to the successful trial we will be purchasing these vehicles for our London bound deliveries.
4. CDL has changed its pallet wrap to an environmentally friendly substitute material.
5. All pallets and boxes are reused wherever possible.
6. Temperature monitors have been fitted within the warehouses to monitor temperatures every 15 minutes to save on unnecessary heating. Ceiling fans have been fitted that turn on automatically in the afternoons to push down the warm air, therefore reduce heating.
7. Energy saving light bulbs and sensors have been fitted in offices.
8. **Since June 2010 CDL has been registered to act as a Carrier and Broker of Controlled Waste. All of our waste is disposed of in a controlled manner and additionally we can provide advise and recycling services to our customers.**
